
# PA Law Enforcement Officer of the Year!

# **Police Commendations**

On March 19, 2024, officers from Plumstead Township received Merit and Commendation awards from Solebury Township and Doylestown Township for their responses and actions involving highrisk incidents that they assisted with.

Chief Dominick Bellizzie presented Corporal Michael Johnson of Plumstead Township Police Department with an Official Commendation. Commendation of Merit was awarded for life saving measures performed during a call for a suicidal subject that Corporal Johnson assisted Solebury Township with early January 2024.





Plumstead Township Police Department's Ofc. Patrick Raubenstine was presented a Commendation by Chief A. Dean Logan of Doylestown Township for his actions in assisting in the apprehension of a burglary suspect. Ofc. Raubenstine was joined by officers from Doylestown Township and Buckingham Township in receiving the award. Officer Thomas Rutecki was awarded a Life Saving by Chief A. Dean Logan of Doylestown Township for his actions in assisting in saving the life of a suicidal person on Swamp Rd. at Rte. 611 Bypass overpass. Ofc. Rutecki was joined by Ofc. Patrick Raubenstine and Ofc. Matthew Sozio and members of Doylestown Township and Buckingham Township Police Departments who received Commendations for their actions on the night of the incident. Excellent work by all!

# OFFICER THOMAS J. RUTECKI IS AWARDED THE POLICE STAR

On January 2, 2024, at quarter after 12am, Officer Thomas J. Rutecki was requested to assist members of the Doylestown Township Police Department in looking for a report of a fifteen year old, suicidal female. A female was reported to be sitting on top of an unknown 611 Bypass overpass bridge. Officer Rutecki immediately responded to the Rte 313 overpass at the route 611 Bypass, finding the female straddling the overpass bridge guardrail above the bypass below.

Officer Rutecki exited his patrol car and approached the female. Officer Rutecki remained calm and attempted to build a bond with the female by talking about school and her school activities. He used exceptional active listening skills while under a great deal of stress. While speaking with the female, Officer Rutecki had the foresight to request all traffic stopped along the 611 Bypass.



During the incident, the female swung both legs over the guardrail, now facing the 611 Bypass. Officer Rutecki continued to use his communication skills, showing empathy and remaining calm. As Officer Rutecki was speaking with the female

for five and a half minutes, he was able to eventually seize an opportunity to physically secure the female and pull her from the bridge, safely ending this incident.

Officer Rutecki's actions on January 2, 2024, are commendable. On this night, Officer Rutecki used his training, skills and abilities, along with his years of police experience and demonstrated heroic policework. It is an honor and privilege to have Officer Rutecki work for the Plumstead Township Police Department.

The Police Star is issued to an officer who has displayed heroic actions above and beyond the call of duty under conditions less than extreme, but with substantial risk to the officer's safety. In many cases, police Command Staff are not on-scene to witness these heroic actions. But in this case, Officer Rutecki activated his in-car and body worn cameras to document the event. I have watched this event several times from Ofc. Rutecki's recorded video can attest to the fact that, due to his actions, a tragedy was averted and a young life was saved.

On this date, March 13th, 2024, Officer Thomas J. Rutecki is awarded the Police Star for displaying heroic actions above and beyond the call of duty.



Have you received one of these bright vellow postcards? If so, that is because the Township records indicate that it has been three years or more since you last had your septic system pumped.

Pennsylvania requires municipalities to monitor properties that have an on-lot septic system to ensure that each system is pumped every three years. This State requirement is to minimize/ prevent a potential health and environmental issue if an on-lot septic system fails.

Once your on-lot septic system has been pumped, you must provide the Township with a pump report and/or invoice to update our records. The documentation can be dropped off at the Township Building, or emailed to Michelle Storti, Municipal Administrator, at mstorti@plumstead.gov.

Ordinance No. 2021-05 - Plumstead Township Sewage Management Ordinance requires all on-lot septic systems to be pumped & inspected by a registered pumper/hauler every THREE (3) years.

Our records indicate that your on-lot septic system is due for an inspection & pumping.

To bring your property into compliance, you must:

- Have your on-lot septic system serviced by a registered pumper/hauler.
- nd your septic report and/or invoice to the Township via email to mstorti@plumstead.gov.

Drop the report and/or invoice off at the Township Building - 5186 Stump Road

# WATER SYSTEM NOTES

Calls come into the Public Works office from time to time regarding water quality concerns and excess use issues.

Potable water is provided to customers from ground water wells across the township. Most notable is the high, naturally occurring, mineral content (hardness) that can cause light discoloration and sediment build up. The township addresses this concern by flushing the system through fire hydrants at least annually. Flushing moves a large volume of water all at once, up, and out of the system through a fire hydrant. This carries sediment and other naturally occurring elements that have settled out in the water main.

From time to time, we receive calls about "cloudy" water. In most cases, this is simply air in the water. If you fill a clear glass from your tap and see cloudiness, let the glass sit for several minutes and the air will dissipate. You will know it was air even if you were to take a spoon and quickly stir the water in the glass. The water should remain clear. Air can enter the home plumbing through malfunctioning equipment or leaks.

In almost every situation, when we receive a call regarding low or no pressure, it is likely caused by something within the home. Typically, a whole house water filter, specialized water treatment equipment, or a malfunctioning water softener is the likely cause. In rare cases the cause can be hydrant use for a fire, or a water main break. Each of these appliances requires some level of service on a regular basis. Malfunctions include filters not being changed at regular intervals and are a common cause of quality issues.

A malfunctioning water softener that was installed and had never been serviced was the recent cause for an extremely high-water bill. Thousands of gallons of water went "down the drain" and had to be paid for by the customer. Please consult the owner's manuals and reputable service companies for more information on the proper management of these appliances. Adding salt and allowing the unit to automatically backwash are not the only things that need to be done to a water softener.


Finally, you can check your water usage by simply monitoring the water meter in your home. At a quiet time when no use is occurring, stand at your water meter. The numbers/dial should not be moving. If it is, you may have a toilet leaking or other appliance allowing water to flow freely. You can read your own meter on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis and calculate your usage to see if you believe it to be within a normal range.

Please see the photograph above right. Inside the home, the township is ONLY responsible for the water meter. All other plumbing close to or around the meter is the responsibility

of the homeowner. There are two large brass nuts on either side of the meter head. The meter should be sealed with a small wire to prevent unauthorized meter removal. Anything leaking outside these two nuts is the responsibility of the homeowner.



We have a responsibility to provide clean, safe water, and we do. While we cannot offer specific advice, we hope that these few general topics will be seriously considered as a part of your normal home maintenance and care.



# "WHY WE CAN'T JUST SAY NO! TO LAND DEVELOPMENT"

The function of the LPEAC is to further our township's goals in preserving open space, which is typically accomplished through Conservation Easements and other preservation covenants that run with the Deed that will Preclude future development.

The issue of "Just Say NO to Development" is routinely raised at Planning Commission and BOS meetings when Development is proposed. The primary goal of the LPEAC is to preserve our beautiful, natural, bucolic and ecologically important land in our township. The LPEAC works towards accomplishing these goals by educating Plumstead residents on the benefits of preserving land in the Township. By Informing and Promoting Conservation Easements to current landowners in the township this avoids the issue of "Saying No" because these easements can preserve the properties into perpetuity.

# Benefits of Land Preservation for property owners & our community:

- Landowners continue to own and use their property
- Protects wildlife, trees and plants & ecosystems
- Protects natural resources Groundwater, streams, rivers, wetlands and more
- Protects farming and other agriculture
- Scenic benefits for owners and neighbors
- Protects historic land and buildings
- Tax benefits (Income, Estate, State etc)

The LPEAC is here to educate the Plumstead Township community on all of these aspects, to inform Landowners of this opportunity and funding programs that are available, and advise all residents about Preservation benefits.

Plumstead Township's beautiful open spaces, easy access, and quality of life make it an attractive place to live for many. But rapid growth and development can change the scenic landscape of Plumstead Township, making it less attractive to people who live here. Over the past few decades, new, large-scale housing developments have been built in many places in Central Bucks County. A common theme in responses to the township resident survey was a general aversion to new development and a desire to maintain the township's character.

So if sprawl and development potentially change the township in a negative way, why can't the township just tell developers to go elsewhere? And why would we accommodate development by allowing higher density uses in some parts of the township?

Two reasons prevent Plumstead from stopping development altogether and even compel the township to accommodate it.

- 1. Plumstead Township cannot keep private property owners from gaining some economic use out of their properties. Widely known as the "takings clause," the Fifth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution states "nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation." When a government regulation denies all economic use or value of a property, a "taking" of property results. Applied in a land use regulatory context, this means that all property must be zoned to allow for some form of viable economic use.
- 2. Every municipality must also provide for basic forms of housing and all institutional, commercial, and industrial uses. In a series of court decisions, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court found that every community must provide for its "fair share" of each particular use, so Plumstead Township can't just prohibit what it perceives as undesirable uses.

If the amount of land zoned for a particular use is disproportionately small or if the use cannot be reasonably accommodated under the provisions of the zoning ordinance, then the courts will hold the ordinance to be exclusionary, will grant relief, and permit the developer to build whatever they wish, despite the municipality's zoning ordinance. Thus, to meet this fair share requirement, Plumstead's zoning ordinance must contain provisions for all basic forms of housing and other common types of development.

Many people want to preserve Plumstead Township in a state that they desire. But if every community did this, there would be nowhere for anyone to go. Because of this, the law requires that every community allow for some growth to accommodate the needs of the greater population.

Moreover, the township should not want to completely stop development and growth. A well-planned development area that allows different forms of development provides a stimulus to the local and regional economy, and the township has tools available to effectively guide growth that benefits the town and its residents. Anticipated and planned increases in ratables for the township helps offset the increasing cost of services and provides an adaptable economic engine that can keep the municipality financially stable, but not stagnant. Planning allows appropriate and reasonable growth that helps existing residents and those who would also want to take advantage of Plumstead Township's high quality of life.




